

The Board of Education seeks parents and guardians of public school students from all grade levels (pre-K to 12th grade) and communities to serve on the Parent Advisory Council (PAC).

The PAC's mission is to advise the Board of Education on issues of concern to families of students in our public schools. PAC members are unpaid volunteers and serve for a two-year term.

The PAC works to:

- Actively reach out to communicate with families across the city, to understand and represent parent perspectives about school programs, student services, and other district policy issues
- Present recommendations to the Board of Education to support academic achievement among all public school children
- Ensure that Board of Education policy decisions are informed by the voices of parents and guardians who reflect the district's student populations.

<u>Eligibility</u>: To be eligible for the PAC, you must be the parent or guardian of a student enrolled in an SFUSD public school, including Early Education pre-kindergarten schools.

Membership Requirements: Members of the PAC are expected to attend PAC meetings once a month during the school year, and to help represent the PAC at two School Board meetings each year.

PAC members are also expected to help organize and conduct community meetings, attend occasional meetings with the Board of Education or SFUSD staff, and participate in parent outreach activities.

PAC members spend six to ten hours a month during the school year on these activities.
